


## SHOWING HAND RECORDS ON YOUR RESULTS WEB SITE

If you load the deal file into the session or event match, that deal file is automatically uploaded with the session and no external deal files need to be uploaded. This applies if you're uploading to a Altosoft / BridgeAustralia site, or a Pianola or Bridge-Club.org site.

However, you will still need to make sure the TXT, BRI or PBN file is in a location that Compscore3 will search for it to be loaded.

You can always tell if a deal file has been successfully loaded into a session or match. Once loaded, a button appears on the Bridgemate Results – see pic at right.





Deal files can be loaded into a session one of two ways:

## ENTRY VIA THE SESSION SETUP FORM

You can enter the deal file name on the Session Setup form.

File names can be entered in "shorthand". This process first expands the file name you entered by adding any prefix and suffix you've nominated when you set up the Web Upload parameters under **Options – Web Site**.


For example, if you enter 123 as the deal file, and have "sbc" as the prefix and ".txt" as the suffix, Compscore3 will look for a file called sbc123.txt.

Compscore3 will check in 3 folders for this file, specifically:

- Compscore3\Web\Deal Files,
- Compscore3\Web\Deal Files\Archive
- the folder is any you have as your Additional Deal File path under Web options.

If it finds the file in one of these locations, it will load it into the session. If it can't find the file, it will show the deal file name you've entered in red.

You can also selected a deal file via the Browse button.



## ENTRY VIA SEPARATE DEAL FILE IMPORT PROCESS

You can load a deal file into any session or event match from the **Setup** tab under the **Advanced Functions, Deal Files** tab. This process allows you to browse to any folder and also allows you to print the hand record.

This is the only method of loading a deal file into an event match.

**Import Deal File**

This process lets you import the deal file for this session / match. When a deal file is present, the anomalies test will include the actual hands in its tests. BRI files do not contain details of makeable contracts, but Demonstrator Pro TXT files do.

#### THINGS TO NOTE...

Of the 3 supported deal file formats, BRI files contain the hands only, whereas PBNs and TXTs contain the hands and makeables.

The old process in Compscore2/3 involved loading a separate TXT or BRI file to the web site. That will still work in Compscore3 but is made redundant by the above. In other words, as long as you load the deal file into the session or match, there is no need to upload the TXT or BRI files to the web site.
